theaters. Wild Space is the only performing arts company in the City specializing in site-based work, and has presented more than 30 site-based events at more than 22 sites, indoors and out.

Wild Space is committed to diversity in its Board membership, hiring and programming. The Board of Directors addresses Diversity, Equity and Inclusion (DEI) through discussion at each Board meeting, staff and Board training, and programmatic initiatives. Racial/ethnic minorities - Latinx (1) and Asian American (1) - comprise 18% of the Board. In 21-22, 52% of the company's dancers were artists of color: African American (4), Asian American (4), and Latinx (1).

Wild Space's culturally responsive programming fully considers the context of people served through community partnerships, cultural representation in hiring, and program structures prioritizing participant voice, choice and leadership. As the resident dance company at Lincoln Center Middle School for the Arts (LCA), Wild Space collaborates with teachers and staff to provide opportunities for LCA students to study dance. School-year residencies and teacher hiring reflect participant demographics. In 21-22, 75% of the company's teaching artists were people of color: African American (4), Latinx (1), ...

...and Native American (1). Through the youthled creation of an original performance, program structure validates student voice and choice. Student surveys determine future programming.

New in 2022, InSite: Choreographic

Apprenticeship addresses racial disparities in dance (https://datausa.io/) by developing, financially supporting and producing choreographers of color. InSite creates access to dance in underserved neighborhoods through free, minority-led community performances and education programming. The program premiered in May 2022 in Milwaukee's diverse Washington Park neighborhood (ZIP Code 53208). In June 2023, InSite will feature 5 choreographers of color creating new site-specific work at Forest Home Cemetery (ZIP Code 53215).

How will your organization know it achieved the goals of the MAB ordinance listed above? This should include methods used to evaluate your programming.

Wild Space evaluates its programming by collecting attendance data at performances and outreach sites. Wild Space performances are regularly reviewed by the region's professional art critics and writers.

Through partnerships with Milwaukee Public Schools (MPS), Wild Space education/outreach programs reach students who are 50% Black/ African American, 28% Hispanic/Latino, 10% White, 8% Asian, 4% Two or More Races, 87% Economically Disadvantaged, 20% Students with Disabilities, 13% English Learners (MPS data, 2020-2021). Student and teacher surveys assess participant achievement of the following arts and humanities goals:

Skill: 70% of participants will increase their skill level in dance.

Self-discipline: 60% of participants will increase their self-discipline by demonstrating the ability to coordinate a dance within a group.

Critical thinking: 60% of participants will increase their critical thinking skills by identifying connections among arts and academic disciplines in their work.

Community connections: 60% of participants will

increase their understanding of how a community is shaped by economic, cultural and ethnic influences through hands-on creative work.

Collaboration: 70% of participants will increase cooperative skills by demonstrating the ability to create a collaborative performance piece within a group.

Programming will include a full season of three shows - one site-specific show, one theater show, and one show producing the work of Black, Indigenous, People of Color (BIPOC) choreographers with free community performances in new, underserved neighborhoods. Performances will involve a total of 25 paid artists and serve more than 1,000 patrons.
